A PROVEN MODEL



The "One Family" model combines the benefits of single-sex education with the enriching opportunities of co-educational activities, fostering mutual respect, meaningful relationships and collaboration between boys and girls. With one physical location, families benefit from ease of transportation, compatibility of schedules and calendars, and joint activities for parents and families.



Our innovative model of single-sex education on a co-educational campus emphasizes the inherent complementarity between the sexes. 
